Bullying of a student or group of st udents can be manifested through written, verbal, physical, or emotional means and may occur in a variety of forms including, but not limited to

- x verbal, written/printed or graphic exposure to derogatory comments, extortion, exploitation, name calling, or rumor spreading either directly though another person or group or through cyber bullying,
- x exposure to social exclusion or ostracism,
- x physical contact including but not lim ited to pushing, hitting, kicking, shoving, or spitting,
- x damage to or theft of personal property.

Cyber bullying: Cyber bullying is, but not limited to, any act of bullying committed by use of electronic technology or electronic communication devices, including telephonic devices, social networking and other internet communications, on school computers, networks, forums and mailing lists, or other District-owned property, and by means of an individual's personal electronic media and equipment.

Harassment: Harassment is intentional beha vior by a student or group of students that is disturbing or threat

Disciplinary action may result for bullyin g which occurs outside of the school and the school day when such bullyin g results in a substantial physical, mental, or emotional negative effect on the victim while on school grounds, school property, school buses, at school bus stops, or at school sponsored events and activities, or when such act(s) interfere with the authority of the

Information will be provided to staf f members at the beginning of each instructional year and on the first day of employment for new employees. The Superintendent shall establish procedures designed to protect the health and safety of students who are physica Ily harmed as the result of bullying. These will include, when appropriate, procedures for contacting emergency medical services, law enforcement agencies, or both.

Knowingly submitting a false report under this policy shall subject the student to discipline up to and includ ing suspension or expulsion. Where disciplinary action is necessary pursuant to any part of this policy, relevant District policies shall be followed.

Law enforcement authorities shall be noti fied any time District officials have a reasonable belief that an incidence of bullying is a violation of the law.

STUDENT VIOLENCE / HARASSMENT / INTIMIDATION / BULLYING

The District does not tolerate bullying in any form. Further, the District shall investigate each complaint of bully ing and will take appropriate, timely, and responsive action.

Bullying: Bullying may occur when a student or group of students engages in any form of behavior that includes, but is not limited to, such acts as intimidation and/or harassment that forms a pattern of such behavior. repeated over time, and that

- x has the effect of physically harming a student, damaging a student's property or placing a student in reasonable fear of harm or damage to property,
- x is sufficiently severe, persistent or pervasive that the action, behavior or threat creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive environment in the form of physical or emotional harm,
- x occurs when there is a real or perce ived imbalance of power or strength. or
- x may constitute a violation of law.

Any student who feels he or she has been the victim of bullying or suspects other students of being bullied should f ile a complaint with the principal or the principal's designee or other school employee. The student's report may be provided verbally or in writing. A student's verbal report will be documented in writing by the employee receiving the report.

Any staff member who becomes aware of or suspects that a student is experiencing bullying shall immediately no tify the principal or the principal's designee. Employees may initially give ve rbal notice to the principal or the principal's designee, but shall submit a written report to the principal or the principal's designee within one (1) school day of the verbal report.

REGULATION **REGULATION** of not reporting a bullying incident or suspicion of bullying. The information shall be disseminated to District personnel at the beginning of each year and as the Superintendent otherwise determines to be appropriate.

The principal or the principal's designee is responsible to ensure information related to bullying is disseminated to students, and parents and guardians. The information shall include, but not be limited to, Governing Board policy, incident reporting, support services (proactive and reactive) and students rights. The dissemination of this information will

- x occur during the first (1st) week of each school year,
- x be posted in each classroom and in common areas of the school,
- x be summarized in the student handb ook and on the District website, and
- x be provided to each incoming student during the school year at the time of registration.

The principal or the principal's desi gnee is also responsible to ensure information is disseminated to all students who report bullying, including, at the time the incident is reported, a wri tten copy of student rights, protections and support services available to the student; a copy of the report shall also be given to the student's parent(s)/guardian(s).

The principal or the principal's designee is responsible for the maintenance of documentation related to bullying.

The Governing Board of the Deer Valley Un ified School District believes it is the right of every student to be educated in a positive, safe, caring, and respectful learning environment. The Governing Board further believes a school environment that is inclusive of these tra its maximizes student achievement, fosters student personal growth, and helps a st udent build a sense of community that promotes positive participation as citizens in society.

To assist in achieving a school environment based on the beliefs of the Governing Board, bullying in any form will not be tolerated.

Bullying: Bullying may occur when a student or group of students engages in any form of behavior that includes such acts as intimidation and/or harassment that

- x has the effect of physically harming a st udent, damaging a student's property, or placing a student in reasonable fe ar of harm or damage to property,
- x is sufficiently severe, persistent or pervasive that the action, behavior, or threat creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive environment in the form of physical or emotional harm,
- x occurs when there is a real or perceiv ed imbalance of power or strength, or
- x may constitute a violation of law.

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Cyber bullying: Cyber bullying is, but not limited to, any act of bullying committed by use of electronic technology or electronic communication devices, including telephonic devices, social networking and other internet communications, on school computers, networks, forums and mailing list, or other District-owned property, and by means of an individual's personal electronic media and equipment.

Harassment: Harassment is intentional behavior by a student or group of students that is disturbing or threatening to another student or group of students. Intentional behaviors that characterize har assment include, but are not limited to, stalking, hazing, social exclusion, name calling, unwanted physical contact and unwelcome verbal or written comments, photographs and graphics. Harassment may be related, but not limited to, race, cultural background, economic status, si ze or personal appearance. Harassing behaviors can be direct or indirect and by use of social media.

Intimidation: Intimidation is intentional behavior by a student or group of students that places another student or group of students in fear of harm of person or property. Intimidation can be manifested emotionally or physically, either directly or indirectly, and by use of social media.

Students are prohibited from bullying on school grounds, school property, school buses, at school bus stops, at school sponsored events and activities, and through the use of electronic technology or electronic communication equipment on school computers, networks, forums, or mailing lists.

Disciplinary action may result for bullying which occurs outside of the school and the school day when such acts result in a substantial physical, mental, or emotional negative effect on the victim, while on school grounds, school property, school buses, at school bus stops, or at school sponsored events and activities, or when such act(s) interfere with the authority of the school system to maintain order. All suspected violations of law will be reported to local law enforcement.

Students who believe they are experiencing being bullied or expect another student is bullied should report their concern to any staff member of the School District. School personnel are to maintain appropriate confidentiality of the reported information.

Reprisal by any student directed toward a student or employee related to the reporting of a case or a suspected case of bullying shall not be tolerated, and the individual(s) will be subject to the discip lines set out in applicable District policies and administrative regulations.

Students found to be bullying others will be disciplined up to and including suspension or expulsion from school.

Knowingly submitting a false report under this policy shall subject the student to discipline up to and including suspension or expulsion. Where disciplinary action is necessary pursuant to any part of this policy, relevant District policies shall be followed.

Law enforcement authorities shall be notified any time District officials have a reasonable belief that an incidence of bullying is a violation of the law.
